Things are looking good but fate lends a cruel hand with suspension failure. The car's sadly out of the rally but the team are now looking forward to securing an entry on the Network Q Rally in November. The car's had a hard season and West Midlands Motorsport set to with a comprehensive rebuild to ensure it can handle the torturous terrain.




September
