# HISTORY OF THE WINTER RALLY

Over the years the Winter Rally has become widely regarded as one of the best-promoted national events in the country. Always popular with spectators and competitors alike, the rally is accessible and exciting to watch. This year, you will have even more chances to catch the action. A major innovation this year is the addition of the second run at the ever popular Winter Gardens spectator special. Traditionally, the Winter Rally has started with this spectacular blast along Bournemouth's sea front, but for the first time, the rally will finish with second stage in the Winter Gardens, providing a dramatic finale to the day's action.

## **European Format**

Last year, Clerk of the Course Rick Smith introduced the innovation of running to a European format, with loops of stages interspersed with central servicing at a single venue. While the loop format is retained, servicing will be split between two separate venues, much to the delight of Bournemouth football fans! Why? Well, servicing on the Winter Rally normally takes place at King's Park. Never, in the history of the event has Bournemouth Football Club needed the venue, because they've always been knocked out of the Cup before the rally arrived. This time, Bournemouth FC are still in the thick of the action! They'll be playing at home on the day of the rally, so the first service will still take place at King's Park, but the second service, in the afternoon, will be situated at Avon Forest Park on the A31, south of Ringwood, thanks to Bournemouth's success. Well done lads! Please remember, however, that if you want to see high performance rally cars being totally rebuilt in a few minutes, it is best to catch the action at King's Park in the morning, and avoid the second service. There's very little parking at Avon Forest Park and it is sure to be very congested.

## In the Beginning

The Winter Rally wasn't always a major spectator sports event. Like so many special stage rallies of its type, the event began life as a small, local navigational competition on public roads. It has since gone through many changes to arrive at its current status as the major rally in the south of England.

In 1974, in the guise of the Southern Rally, it ran overnight for the first time and put both navigators and drivers to the test around the tight and twisty lanes of Surrey and Sussex.

Today's more spectator-orientated format, with the vast majority of the competition run in daylight on forestry gravel track, was adopted in 1981. In 1984 car giant Citroen gave its name to five rallies between 1984 and 1987 — 1985 was a particularly good year for southern rallying with two events in the same year! With Citroen's involvement came several fundamental changes

— it first became known as the Winter Rally and it was also at this time that Southern Car Club entered into an organisational partnership with Croydon & District Motor Club and the whole event moved lock, stock and barrel to its new home in the forests of Ringwood and Wareham.

### **Come in Bournemouth**

The evolution continued in 1986, when the previously 'restricted' status event became a 'national', prior to being selected as the opening round of the British National Championship the following year. To recognise its enhanced position as a showpiece for rallying in the south, the organisers chose to move to a new home and a new base: Bournemouth, with the impressive Swallow Highcliff Hotel taking on the role of Rally Headquarters.

After Citroen, Mazda Cars (UK) picked up the mantle of sponsor in 1988, heralding the start of a six year association which led to the rally becoming generally known as the 'Mazda'. In 1992 Car-Line, part of the Preferred Assurance Group, joined Mazda in the event title and received enough feedback from their involvement to persuade them to do it again in 1993. Sugar and syrup giant Tate & Lyle also joined in the fun along with Magna Motors, Bournemouth's Mazda dealership.

### **Innovation**

Route notes — compiled by former International co-driver Rob Arthur — were supplied to all competitors for the first time in 1992 and these described the severity of the corners and natural hazards to be found in each of the timed special stages. While potentially increasing the pace of the rally, it was felt that the notes would make it safer than the traditional 'drive-on-sight' approach adopted by most organisers. The innovation found favour with competitors and has been continued for each subsequent event.

Funnily enough, despite its name, the Winter Rally has yet to see snow. 'Rain-lashed' is a phrase often used by local journalists and then, in 1989, high winds brought down hundreds of trees in the week prior, threatening for a time the viability of the event. Only the sterling work by the Forestry Commission prevented what may have been the first cancellation of this hardy annual! Then, at the opposite end of the spectrum, in 1992 drivers were complaining of strong sunlight making it difficult to see!

However, the vagaries of the British climate will mean that good weather is by no means assured as competitors gather at the new Rally Headquarters at the Wessex Hotel, for the start of another season of events in the county's most popular Rally Championship!


